Water Shut Off

- To minimize leaks and frozen pipes, please shut off the water supply at your house before you leave. You should have a water shut off as part of your plumbing system, and if you do not have one, you need to install one.
- Do not use the EAR water meter/valve to shut off the water at your house.

Water Outages

- Be prepared: have extra water for emergencies (drinking water and extra water to flush the toilet, 5 – 20 gallons) at your house in case there is a water outage.

Work on plumbing

- Before you work on your plumbing, contact EAR first!
- Do not do any work on EAR water lines.
- If EAR water lines are damaged by you or your contractor, you will be responsible for the cost of repairs.

Snow Removal

- Our cabins are in the high mountains we can get lots of snow, sometimes many inches in one storm.
- Be prepared: If it has been snowing, you may not have access to all roads in EAR when you arrive or you may be snowed in until the plows can get to you. During these times, there may be power outages (NORA).
- We have a contractor for snow removal though we are not his only clients. Snow will be plowed as soon after a storm as possible. Plowing initiates when 8 inches of snow has fallen or is anticipated.
